Memorial to be Registered of the last Will and
Testament of Hannah Farrell wife of Robert
Farrell of the Township of the Gore of Camden
in the county of Kent in the Province of Canada
in form figure and manner as follows. In the
Name of God Amen.

I, Hannah Farrell wife of Robert Farrell of the Township of the Gore of Camden in the country of Kent and Province of Canada being weak in body but of sound mind and memory thanks being unto, god for the same do make and declare this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following Viz, I give and bequeath to my dear Husband Robert Farrell his support and maintenance during his natural life and I make it the first charge on my property hereafter described and whereas I am coheiress with my sister, Mrs. Alice Tulley wife of Edward Tulley we being the only children of Joseph Lee deceased and by Virtue of being such Coheiress I am entitled to one Half of the undivided property hereafter mentioned, namely the East Half of lot No. Ten on the Twelfth and the East and West Halves of lot number Ten in the Thirteenth Concession of the said Gore of Camden formerly Dawn and for which property we hold the queen's Patent, and whereas it is agreed that I hold possession enjoy forever The East Half of the south Half of the said lot No. Ten in the Thirteenth concession of the Gore of Camden aforesaid and I wish to dispose of the same in the following manner, namely I give devise and bequeath to my son Thomas his heirs and assigns for ever Twenty acres of said lot namely the south Twenty adjoining the Property of M. John Tiffin on condition that he maintains and keeps the younger and unmarried portion of the family until they come of age or are married and should he refuse or fail to do so then I leave devise and bequeath the said Twenty acres of land to my second son Joseph Lee in addition to the Portion hereinafter devised to him. Subject to the same conditions. To my second son Joseph Lee aforesaid I give devise and bequeath Ten acres namely the Ten adjoining and being North of My son Thomas. Twenty acres to be possessed and enjoyed by him and his heirs and assigns forever. To my son Edward I give and devise Ten acres namely the Ten acres north of that of

my son Joseph Lees to him his heirs and assigns for Ever. To my son John his heirs and assigns forever I give devise and bequeath Ten acres of land namely the Ten North of the Ten given to my son Edward above mentioned Said portions of land making or composing the east half of the south half of the
